The Rebuild Site opened at the end of January this year, and since then we have helped 23 community projects with the supply of building materials. We think you'll agree it's a great start, which has only been possible with the support of our Contractor partners.



We provided Harraby Community
Centre with timber to build raised
beds as part of their community
garden project. The community
centre now supports Harraby
residents to grow fresh produce and
plants, contributing to health and
wellbeing, supporting community
cohesion and offering a relaxation
space.

Cumbria Wildlife Trust were provided with slates to edge a pond as part of a project they're running with Carlisle schools, which aims to embed nature and outdoor learning in the curriculum. the project will benefit 600 children this year.

Prism Arts work with artists and people who have additional needs in Carlisle and the surrounding areas. Rebuild provided them with panels of plywood which their artists used for a series of street art workshops with participants. This culminated in a final piece of public art which was on exhibition at the Central Methodist Hall in Carlisle.



Home to Work got in touch regarding a project they're running called 'Goodlives', which takes people out of classrooms and allows them to develop skills outdoors. Rebuild were able to provide materials which support gardening, and, as the project is ongoing, it will support community members for years to come.

We supported the newly formed Caldew Squirrel Initiative with timber to build wooden squirrel feeding boxes to be placed in woodland between Sebergham and Caldbeck. From the materials Rebuild provided the group were able to build 38 feeding stations, which will support the conservation of the endangered red squirrel in the local area



The **Creative Quarter** is a new arts initiative offering affordable creative spaces for artists and community groups to explore their proactice, supporting metal health and wellbeing of our communities. We provided materials to put on their first full scale art exhibition

Community Shed (formerly Men in Sheds) needed materials for a joinery project; from the materials Rebuild provided they were able to build work surfaces in a shed and numerous members of the group were able to benefit from the project.



Florence Arts Centre, part of the Egremont & Area Regeneration Partnership, was provided with materials for arts projects. From the materials Rebuild provided, hundreds of people will be able to enjoy the improved spaces for years to come.

We provided **Ragtag Arts** with materials to fill their loose parts play trolleys for local primary schools in the Kendal area. Hundreds of Primary School children will benefit from these trolleys over the school year.



We worked with Age UK
Carlisle & Eden and I Can
Health and Fitness CIC to
provide paving materials
for a community garden,
facilitating a path to
make the garden
wheelchair accessible.
The garden is now open
to the community and
over 100 people will
benefit.

Garnet Therapeutic Counselling, which offers equine facilitated counselling, were in need of some fencing to develop an area for groups to meet and work in the orchard. The materials Rebuild provided has supported the work that they do and the many people that benefit from it.



Introducing Re:Play

Our Schools Loose Parts Play Project

What is loose parts play?

'Loose parts' play, is the idea that children can potentially get more out of the experience of relying on their own imagination to create 'play', rather than relying on toys. In other words, children have more to gain from playing with everyday objects, and potentially enjoy it more, than pushing them to use toys.

At Rebuild we receive a lot of materials which can be put to good use as loose parts play components. These may be pipe connectors, gutters, timber offcuts, cable reels... the list is endless!

Loose parts play encourages teamwork, communication skills, physical development, and is a way to get children active outside, supporting mental health too.

Since we opened at the end of January, we have provided ten schools with materials for their loose parts play cupboards!.
